What does it feel like to step into a new term of learning at Delabole Primary School? Well it looks a lot like this....









All around the school there was a tangible buzz of anticipation as we returned after the half term break and the children found themselves instantly transported into a variety of realms for learning. Imagine if there were a mystery to be solved and, along with your Foundation & Class 1 friends, you were challenged to decide if a band of brothers living in Sherwood Forest were heroes or villains. Picture the scene as the Class 3 children silently file past a mysterious lidded box filled with objects – each one chosen with care to suggest a great sorrow unleashed on the world. What if they had to open Pandora's box? Meanwhile, in Class 2, the children wound back time to find that there was a different sense of justice in a Victorian schoolroom, and girls did not enjoy the same opportunities as boys! Staying Safe Online

The most important thing we do is to keep children safe and sometimes the conversation around how we do that together with parents, is brought into sharp focus. Many of you will be aware of a recent surge in concerns over internet pop ups, and their capacity to impact on children significantly. As a staff, we have decided not to shine any spotlight on these horrible influences which are designed to harm...rather we would ask that parents simply pay special attention to what their children are viewing online and take steps to ensure they are not unsupervised when using the internet. In school, we have spoken at length with the children without going into any details. They know that if they stumble across anything which 'feels wrong' they must tell an adult. We would ask that parents do the same at home and, rather than fan the flames of media hype, just quietly take control of this scourge on childhood. Aspire have updated their internet safety pages, so do check out the website for signposts to useful organisations.

World Book Day - Thursday 7th March

Rather than use this day as an opportunity to dress up, we felt that we would like to shift the focus back onto our passion for reading. There are so many incredible books in the world – as many books as there are pebbles on a beach – as I told the children last week. Surely, we should celebrate our collective favourites! As a staff, we have been looking closely at our lunchtime arrangements as we have become increasingly aware that this part of our day can be quite challenging for some children. We notice that children who have had a tricky lunchtime, then find it hard to settle to afternoon learning. We would like to reinvigorate the playground by setting up a rotation of challenges and activities. We would also like to zone off part of the playground with quiet games which can be shared and used to promote friendship. Sometimes children need a more focused activity to help them negotiate relationships such as sharing and compromise and plating a game would be a focus for this.
