Dear parents and carers,

This is the time of year when we begin to really step up the momentum of our end of year celebrations – including our Christmas performance and any community projects/fundraisers. There is a lot to organise so this brief Newsletter is just a brief capture of the key events and dates, so that you can be prepared.



#### **Staffing Update**

One of the most important jobs a school leader does is to steer a steady course through times of change, so that high quality provision for the children remains as consistent as possible. Parents will be aware that, with so many maternities across the schools over the past few months, and some staff changes, it has been a slightly more turbulent time for us after years of continuity. Such is the way with school life, and I have learnt to look at all change as an opportunity to take the school forward.

We have worked extremely hard in order to recruit some really strong staff to cushion this change and I am now in a position to share information about some new appointments, as well as to welcome back Mrs Dickinson, who is so excited to be back in Early Years for four days a week. Mrs Stanley will continue to pick up Fridays until newly appointed staff have completed their safeguarding checks and are cleared to start.



We have appointed Miss Nayeb as a full time TA, and she will become part of the Class 4 team in place of Ms Sanderson. Mrs Ubly is still on school roll until January when her resignation period is completed but will be off sick until then. For that reason, we have been quick to appoint a very experienced part time teacher to cover Friday In Early Years and Monday in Class 1. Stephanie Cook has been an English Lead, Early Years and KS1 Lead and part of the Senior Leadership Team in her previous school. She is also a trained Read Write Inc Reading Leader. This is a really strong appointment and we also have capacity for her to lead interventions in Phonics and KS1 Reading on Wednesdays each week.

Class 2 parents have been informed that, unfortunately, Miss Whymer is really unwell and needs time to be at home and rest. She is looking for a teaching post closer to home as she has such a long commute each day and will be officially leaving us in February. In the interim, whilst she is away, we have booked Mrs Walker and Mrs Prince to cover the class. Both supply teachers know the school and the children well. We have also been fortunate enough to recruit a lovely teacher for Class 2. Victoria Marshall has extensive teaching and leadership experience and has taught both in England and abroad. She brings a wealth of passion and

creativity to the classroom and is an absolute advocate for the development of wellbeing in her children. As a Reading and Phonics expert, she will also add to our really strong English provision.

I am sure you will agree that these very strong additions to our school team, will pave the way to take the school from strength to strength. I have always been fierce about ambitions for our pupils and I know parents will continue to support the school as it drives to maximise the progress of our children, so they can achieve their best potential.
