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Pushchairs In School

Now that winter is almost upon us, we have realised that there is some congestion in the main corridor at Delabole when parents with pushchairs are dropping children off in the morning. We understand that parents do not wish to leave small children in pushchairs outside, but equally, they do create jams in the corridor. In the event of a fire, they would block the main escape route. For that reason, could we ask that any parents wheeling pushchairs into school, park them in the school hall or the outside Climbing Wall Shelter, but remove the child. Thank you for your understanding in this.

Some Help with Standards and Safety

Please could we remind parents that we do not encourage jewellery in school, other than small stud earrings. This is a safety measure but also prevents the loss or breakage of precious objects. We have also noticed increasingly that some children are wearing nail varnish. Whilst we understand the appeal for this, we do not encourage it and would rather nail varnish were removed before coming to school on Mondays. The children look so smart in their uniform and it is so much a part of our identity as a tribe of learners, that we wish to maintain these standards at all times.
