Pupil Voice – The Leadership Tribe

They will have a wide-ranging brief including Health and Safety, Sports, Teaching and Learning, Health and Well Being, Anti Bullying and Sustainability.

Communication

Harvest Festival – Digital Performance

Following sensible advice from the Trust and Public Health England, we will be unable to celebrate Harvest Festival together as a community as we would of course, have loved to do. However, each of the classes will still be presenting a Harvest Performance celebration which will be presented digitally via our online learning platform Seesaw. We will also still be collecting donations in school which will be organised and distributed to our community by our fabulous FoDS. All donations will need to be in school by Monday 18th October.

<u>Riding to School</u>

We have been really encouraged to see the number of children coming to school safely on their bikes or scooters safely wearing helmets despite the increasingly autumnal weather. The bikes, scooters and helmets should be left in the shelter on the field using the playground entrances rather than outside the office. We are currently considering how we can improve our bike and scooter storage solutions working with our Estates Team and the Leadership Tribe and would always welcome suggestions and support.

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Car Parking and Clubs

One of the many challenges of having our wonderful and historic school building is managing its relationship with modernity. In particular, the car park in front of the office is certainly one of those areas. We have noticed an increasing amount of traffic using the car park area across the whole day which presents a risk. There are pedestrians at the start and end of the day and throughout the day. Our children do also use the office entrance for many different reasons. We would kindly request that parents do not bring their cars in that area either to turn or to park. We will also now be using the normal playground exits when children leave their clubs.

Home Learning -Seesaw for Families

Home learning is now up and running on Seesaw. The children have their accounts set up and many are already completing their three tasks that will be set every two weeks. Invites to a sibling app, <u>Seesaw for Families</u>, will be sent out soon for parents and carers to share and celebrate in their children's learning.

However, we need to remind everybody that we are unable to authorise any holidays in term time. We are working hard with our children to cover the curriculum.
