Welcome back to the second half of the Spring Term. It has been a busy week of learning with some great immersion days happening to really help children understand their new enquiry.

This half term, our new value is **JUSTICE** and our Enquiry question across the school is, **'Who holds the power?'** There are some great opportunities in every class for the children to delve deep into what life was like in the past at different times in history. Class 1 will be learning about heroes from the past – focussing on Grace Darling and her heroic rescue at sea, Class 2 will be focussing on the life of a Victorian child. Who held the power at this time? Class 3 will be extending their historical knowledge by exploring another ancient civilisation – Ancient Greece whilst Class 4 delve into learning about power through the construction of the Berlin wall and what this time was like for the people living there.
