Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the final term of the year. It is a busy one with lots of things going on. Please ensure you take note of all the dates below. There will be separate letters for specific events, please keep a look out for these.

Our value is **Wisdom**, and our Enquiry question is '**What can we learn from the past?**' Class 1 will explore how the female fossil hunter Mary Anning unlocked the secrets of the past and why it is hard to find out about women in History. Class 2 children will step aboard the Santa Maria and Golden Hind and follow in the footsteps of Christopher Columbus, Sir Francis Drake and Sir Walter Raleigh to learn about how the great explorers changed our understanding of the world.
